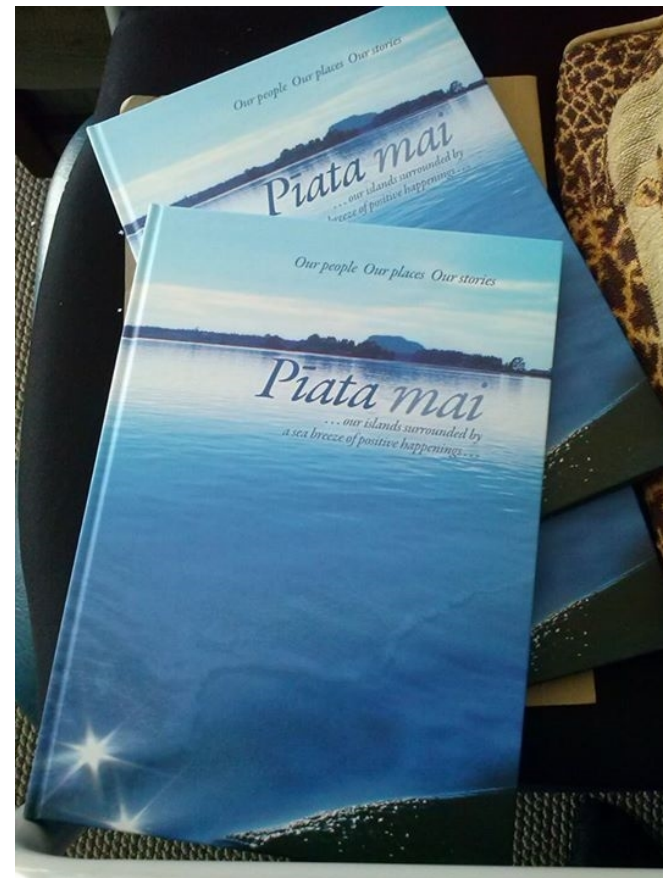

Trust Administrative Functions

- Roles & responsibilities of Joint Board and Trust clearly defined
- Facilitation of application process to fill Trust appointed Joint Board positions
- Initiated the review of Trust Deed and proposed amendments – pending feedback from Trustees
- Sought advice over Port Lease Agreement – letter being drafted by legal advisor





Ngā Poutiriao O Mauao (Joint Management)

Joint Management Arrangements

- Established Mauao working group, jointly engaged DOC to agree on proposed legislation for formalising joint management arrangements – still in progress
- Developed good working relationship with TCC
- MOU Signing (Sept 2013)
- Implement Joint Board appointments (4 iwi) & Chairperson
- Joint Board take over management function in partnership with TCC
- Provide regular reports on management to Trust & meet no less than twice a year
