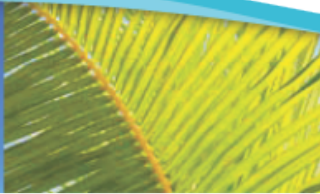
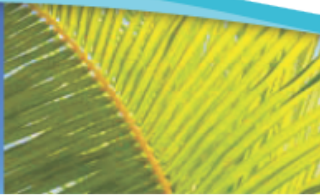


Reserve Management Plans



Reserves Act 1977

- Reserves Act is the primary piece of legislation that governs the administration of public reserves
- Sets out the powers and duties of local authorities as administering bodies of reserves
- Section 41 requires administering bodies to prepare reserve management plans for all reserves under their control



What is a Reserve Management Plan?

- Purpose of a management plan is to ensure ***“the use, enjoyment, maintenance, protection and preservation”*** of reserves
- Provides specific information about the function and management of the reserve
- Allows Council to set in place policies for the day to day management of reserves
- Generally Reserve Management Plans should be reviewed at least every ten years – does not require a complete rewrite



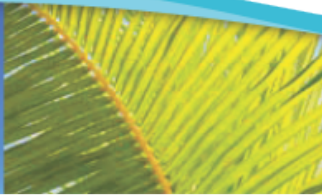
Reserve Management Plan Guidelines 2011

- Established a set of guidelines that provide specific direction when preparing reserve management plans
- Ensure a consistent approach to reserve management planning across the open space network moving forward
- Management focus as opposed to development focus



Mauao Reserve Management Plan

- Mauao currently sits in the Mount Maunganui Reserves Management Plan
- Intention is to prepare a separate individual Reserve Management Plan for Mauao
- Management Plan needs to comply with the principles set out in section 18 relating to Historic Reserves
- Review currently due to commence mid 2012
